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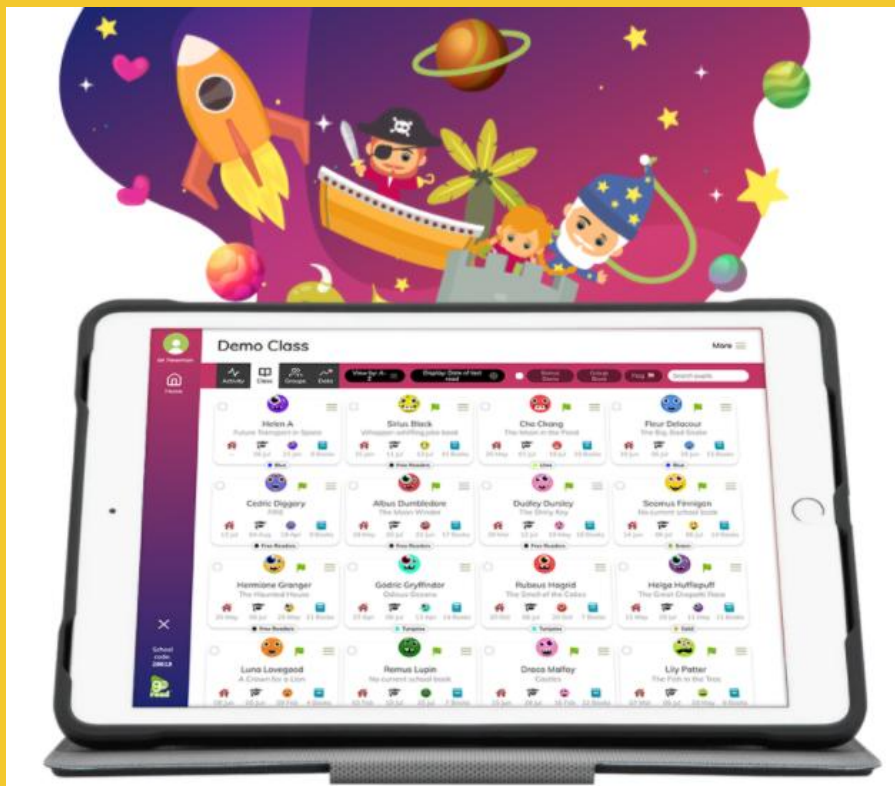

Reading

Expectations:

Children should be reading **everyday**. This doesn't have to be just their reading books. Children can read library books, magazines and age appropriate newspapers.

Parents need to go on the Boom Reader app to comment on their child's reading at least once a week.

If you're struggling to access any of the platforms, please speak to us.

We will be continuing to use
'Go Read.'

It has been renamed 'Boom Reader' but it still fulfils the same purpose.

Homework

We will be setting a project at the start of every half term based around our topic learning.

Projects will be due in on the final week of that half term.

The next project will be set on the first week after October half term (Tuesday 5th November 2024). We will also put this project onto google classroom.

Login's are currently being set up. When they are reading, we will stick them into the back of their spelling books for you to see.

P.E Kit



The PE kit should consist of a yellow polo shirt, school jumper, a pair of black shorts or jogging bottoms and a pair of black pumps or trainers

Uniform



Boys must wear a burgundy sweatshirt, yellow shirt or polo shirt, grey or black trousers and black shoes.



Girls must wear a burgundy sweatshirt or cardigan, a yellow polo shirt, red gingham dress, black or grey skirt/dress or trousers and black shoes.

Toast



- Children are welcome to have toast each week at a cost of 50p however this needs to be paid online (Gateway). You will need to pay at the end of every half term for your child to have toast the following half term.
- Children can also have milk at break times which also needs to be paid online.

Snacks

Children can bring a piece of fruit for their snack at Playtime if they wish to (No chocolate/sweets please!)



Good behaviour

We continue to follow the “Good to be Green” approach with our behaviour management.

1. Non-verbal warning
2. Verbal warning- blue stop and think card-
3. Yellow card (miss 5 mins play)
4. Red card (miss 15 mins play)
5. Behaviour recovery (Senior leaders office)

Praise Assembly

Praise Assembly will take place on **Friday Morning**. If your child has been selected for praise you will receive an invitation on the Thursday before to join us in celebrating your child’s achievements at **8:50am**.

Halos

Children will receive halos for showing our learning behaviours. These can be then spent in our halo shop every half term.

What you can do to help at home?

- Listen to your child read even if this is not their school reading book.
- Ensure that your child completes their topic project.
- Practise spellings, times tables and writing.
- Ensure your child is in school everyday and on time.
- Talk to your child about their learning from the day.
